a. Communication of the Council

a. 2017-2018 Term Vision / Goals

- i. Have a fully functional CAC at every echelon. Would like to have a handful of projects to work on throughout the term to be finished by the end.

b. New Ideas from Representatives

i. Wing Emergency Services Academy

1. Maj Hert: What are we accomplishing in this?

- a. Answer: Striking interest in the cadet core with ES and getting several qualifications and tasks out of the way.

2. Maj Hert: Why would the activity be fun to the cadets?

- a. Answer: It depends on how the activity is set up and how the classes are taught.

3. Lt Baker: How long would this activity be?

- a. Answer: Ideally 3-4 days.

4. Lt Baker: Do CPR Instructors need to be CAP?

- a. Answer: No, but there are plenty that we can have as instructors.

5. Lt Santalov: Should students arrive with some prerequisites (ICUT, IS100, Etc.) already completed?

- a. Answer: It would be highly recommended and ideal, but not a requirement to attend the activity. We will have classes teaching things such as ICUT, IS 100, IS 700, Etc.

6. Lt Santalov: How do we get SET's there? Senior member support?

- a. Answer: Reaching out to the Wing ES Officer and Group ES Officers.
 - 7. Chief Lam: How do we appeal to the younger cadets?
 - a. Answer: Word of mouth after the activity is the best way, but for the first one it comes down to advertising.
 - 8. Lt Anquico: What is the point of the activity other than to get qualifications?
 - a. Answer: To get more cadets involved in ES and taking part in it.
 - ii. Group 2 recommendation / remark: Some squadrons need a new website that is easier to use. For the last BCS/ATS, the packing list was sent out 2-3 days before event, suggests a standardized packing list for ILP's on cawg website for easy cadet access.
 - iii. Group 3 recommendation / remark: Would like more DCS's and BCS/ATS's within nearby area. Would like a color guard/honor guard academy/clinic weekend.
 - iv. Group 4 recommendation / remark: (See Public Affairs committee Section)
 - v. Group 5 Recommendation: Events are mostly planned in south/central, would like more events in the northern area.
 - vi. Group 7 Recommendation: N/A
 - vii. Group 8 Recommendation: Not a strong leadership presence from Group/Wing. Very little activities. More senior member schools such as, TLC/SLS. Would like to have a Group wide cadet staff training day.
- c. News from Region
- i. Cadet Wing Orientation Ride Coordinator
 - 1. Chief Lam: There about 1,400 cadets in the wing, so it would be difficult, but it's doable. Possible North/South coordinator.
 - 2. Lt Santalov: Orientation weekend in specific regions (Groups) in the Wing.
 - 3. Lt Wiggins: Suggesting to start at the group level and see what works/what doesn't work, then move up to Wing level.
 - 4. Maj Hert: There are lots of logistical / participation hurdles to go through.
 - 5. Lt Baker: Running it as a Group team that reports to Wing coordinator

- a. Maj Hert: What happened to Cadet Officers Weekend?

- b. Maj Hert: Having the long-term sub organization of Public Affairs for each ILP/ Wing Activity, aimed not only to the general public, but to the Cadets in Squadrons as well. Similar to the Wing CPO and ILP Coordinator.

 - ii. Members: Baker, Lam, Santalov
- c. CAC page on wing website
 - i. Would like to see the following on the CAC page: Roster with contact info, broken down into Wing/Group/Squadron, documentation from conferences, list of projects that's open to the public, CAC representative bio with picture, area to contact reps or leave comments on projects.
